**New Business:**

3. New Course Introduction to Organic Chemistry and Biochemistry- Sharma. For nursing, premed, food services, clinical, and pharmacology students. The class will be for five (5) credit hours. 4. Change in placement language in the ICC Catalog- Niemeyer. Extend use of placement scores from 2 to 5 years. Gilcris and Owen moved. The measure passed.
