College Overview



Independence Community College was founded in 1925 as grades 13 and 14 of the Independence public school system, we have since evolved into a two-year educational institution accredited by the Higher Learning Commission.

In 1967, we legally separated from the school district, and in 1969, construction of our 68-acre campus on the former Independence Country Club began. By September 1970, we were proud to open the doors to our new site, which now includes the Academic Building, Fine Arts Building, Student Union, Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship, Field House, Administration Building, William Inge Center for the Arts, fitness center, athletic practice fields, disc golf course, a 96-bed multi-structure living complex, and a 200-bed residence hall.

In 2010, we expanded our college by renovating a donated building and opening ICC West, located on the west side of Independence. This campus is home to our technical programs, including Allied Health, Cosmetology, and GED/ABE. We continued to expand in 2012 by completing additional renovations to accommodate our Veterinary Nursing Program, which includes state-of-the-art facilities such as animal wards, a classroom, lab, surgery, pharmacy, prep room, small animal treatment, food prep, grooming, and radiology.

Currently, we offer 28 programs of study for Associates of Arts and/or Science degrees, as well as a range of student support services, Upward Bound, men's and women's athletic programs, and a variety of campus organizations and activities. At Independence Community College, we are committed to providing our students with exceptional educational opportunities and a supportive community.

Purpose Statements

In striving to meet its institutional responsibilities as a community college, Independence Community College sets forth the following purpose statements in definition of its educational programs and services. Students who have completed either a prescribed Career/Technical Education Certificate or Associate of Applied Science degree program will have acquired the requisite skills for obtaining employment or advancement in the field of that educational program.

3. Promoting and Providing Life-Long Learning Opportunities

The College provides individuals with the means to upgrade their job skills and to improve the quality of their lives through academic endeavors.

4. Achieving Basic Skills and/or College Readiness

Through academic and other support services, students can achieve the proficiency required for continuance in higher education, for employment, or for day-to-day communication and computation.

5. Participating in College and Community Sponsored Activities

Students attending Independence Community College can participate in a wide variety of activities aimed at broadening their social, political, physical, and cultural horizons.

Transfer Programs

Students pursuing degrees such as the Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Associate of Fine Arts, and/or Associate of General Studies undergo a rigorous curriculum aimed at preparing them for successful transfer to four-year colleges and universities. Academic Advisors and Success Coaches provide personalized support to ensure students fulfill degree requirements and smoothly transition to their next academic destination. Through partnerships established via the Kansas Board of Regents, ICC offers seamless transfer options, with 120 courses recognized for credit at various Kansas universities.



The Associate of Applied Science degree is tailored to equip students with the skills needed for immediate entry into their chosen field. Our technical courses blend theoretical knowledge with hands-on practice, and students' success is measured by their demonstrated competencies. Industry advisory committees play a crucial role in guiding our technical programs, ensuring that our curriculum and training remain cutting-edge and relevant to the evolving demands of the industry.

ICC NOW

The ICC NOW program offers eligible high school students the chance to take college classes while still attending high school. This experience helps students understand college demands, enrollment processes, and associated costs. William Inge Theatre Festival

Since its inception, the William Inge Theatre Festival, has brought to Independence, Kansas, some of the world's most prestigious playwrights. Arthur Miller, Wendy Wasserstein, August Wilson, Neil Simon, Paula Vogel, and Stephen Sondheim are some of those who have traveled to Independence to accept the Festival's Distinguished Achievement in American Theatre Award. The Inge Festival honors also bestows the Otis Guernsey New Voices in Playwriting award, which recognizes a peer-nominated emerging playwright, the Margaret Goheen Award, for outstanding contributions to theatre in Independence and surrounding area (named after the founder of the Festival), and the Jerome Lawrence Award for contributions to the Inge Festival and the national theatre by a non-playwright.

Veterans Success

ICC is a "Purple Heart College" by the Military Order of the Purple Heart (MOPH). This classification is in recognition of the support for military members, including veterans and their families. ICC has also earned the designation of "Military Friendly School". With the added GREEN ZONE ADVOCACY TRAINING offered for the ICC faculty, staff and student body, our campus is fast becoming a "more military-familiar" campus as well.

Fab Lab ICC
