As a professional conductor, Mr. Markiewicz has served

as artistic director and conductor of several ensembles, including; Imperial Brass, Somerset Valley Orchestra, Raritan Valley Symphonic Band, The Brooklyn Youth Orchestra and the Inter-School Orchestras of New York.

Many of his students have gone on to perform in major metropolitan symphony orchestras and on Broadway. Many have also pursued their own careers in music education.

**ICC Concert Band** is a full-sized 40+ member ensemble. Membership is open to any ICC student or community member that has past experience playing winds and/or percussion. (No audition required.) The band performs a variety of repertoire including pops selections, Broadway medleys, concert band classics and marches. The ICC concert band rehearses one evening each week and performs several concerts throughout the academic year, including; graduations, holiday concerts and at other community events.

**ICC Jazz Band** is a semi-professional full-sized big band. Membership is open to any ICC student or any community member that loves America's greatest art form. The ICC Jazz band regularly plays "gigs" at concert halls, restaurants with full stages and ballrooms throughout Southeast Kansas. The Jazz Band rehearses one evening each week, often directly after concert band rehearsals.
