## College History

Independence Community College (ICC) is a two-year educational institution accredited by the Higher Learning Commission. It was established in 1925 as grades 13 and 14 of the Independence public school system. In 1967, Independence Community College legally separated from the school district. Construction of the new community college on a 68 acre campus, formerly the Independence Country Club, began in 1969. Classes at the new site began in September 1970. ICC campus is now home to the Academic Building, Fine Arts Building, Student Union, Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship, Field House, Administration Building, William Inge Center for the Arts, fitness center, athletic practice fields, disc golf course, 96-bed multi-structure living complex, a 200-bed, and a 135-bed suite-style residence hall.

In 2010, a former large retail space was donated at a location next to the local Walmart. The College renovated the new West Campus, increasing the College's visibility in the community and adding much-needed space for technical programs. A capital campaign was conducted, raising \$760,00 for renovation of the facility. The College has also contributed approximately \$350,000 to the renovation of that building. This campus is located on the west side of Independence and is home to Allied Health, Cosmetology, Veterinary Technology, and Culinary Arts. ICC also maintains a presence downtown through the ICC Foundation office, which is a separate organization from the College. ICC also maintains a presence downtown through the ICC Foundation office, and by partnering with the Innovative Business Resource Center. Currently, ICC's educational and support programming includes 35 programs of study for Associates of Arts and/or Science degrees, 11 programs of study for Certificate completion, two TRIO programs (Student Support Services and Upward Bound), men's and women's athletic programs, and a variety of campus organizations and activities.

#### Mission

ICC's mission statement, "Independence Community College serves the best interests of students and the community by providing academic excellence while promoting cultural enrichment and economic development" shows that ICC is a student and community - centered institution. This statement guides ICC's decisions and actions. ICC works to help their students realize a college education as a transformative experience in their professional and personal lives and for the betterment of the Independence community. To those ends, the aim of our strategic plan is to reinforce ICC's mission by enhancing learning environments, strengthening existing programs, and creating new initiatives so that our college can better support and serve our students, our community, and our state.

## **Determining Key Priorities for ICC:**


Architect One had the unique opportunity to sit down with students and faculty at ICC. During this time, Architect One received very insightful information about ICC and the campus community as a whole. After speaking with students, athletes, faculty, alumni, facilities staff, community leaders and members, faculty representatives, and others, AO sat down and complied the data, here's what we found:

#### **Creating A Vision Through the Charrette Process:**

A charrette is an intensive planning session where key members of a project - including citizens, designers and others stakeholders - collaborate on a vision for development. It provides a forum for ideas and offers the unique advantage of giving immediate feedback to the designers. More importantly, it allows everyone who participates to be a mutual author of the plan.

Through brainstorming and design activity, many goals are accomplished during the charrette process. First, everyone who has a stake in the project develops a vested interest in the ultimate vision. Second, the design team works together to produce a set of finished documents that address all aspects of design. Third, since the input of all the players is gathered at one event, it is possible to avoid the prolonged discussions that typically delay conventional planning projects. Finally, the finished result is produced more efficiently and cost-effectively because the process is collaborative.

Participants usually appreciate the charrette format because they see quick results. Another advantage of a charrette is that it can boost creativity. Furthermore, participants can observe the project from an integrated point of view because charrettes bring together all relevant disciplines to create a plan that balances transportation, land use, economic considerations, and environmental issues.





## **Determining Key Priorities for ICC Cont...**

#### **Key Goals & Priorities:**

- Create a simple goal to increase on-campus students by a certain percentage in 1, 3, 5, 8, and 10 years. A target goal would be to start with a 10% increase in students by year three and a 20% increase by year five. Apart of this goal is to increase student athletics and sports programs in this timetable. By prioritizing identifiable strategies, these goals and efforts will happen.
- Establish a goal for all sports programs to practice on the main campus, and when possible host home games. Strategies should include prioritizing building new sports venues on campus for team practices, and be game-level finished eventually. The gameday venues should enhance the game-day experience for fans, students, alumni, athletes coaches, and employees of ICC. If done properly, it can be your best recruiting and retention tool.

- Develop a strategy to bring clarity to the main entrance of the campus, as well as, develop strategies for way-finding onto and through the campus for pedestrians and vehicles
- Develop a strategy to modernize, enhance and upgrade the two existing large dorms on campus. The goal should be to bring
  them to full occupancy each year moving forward. Included in this strategy is to have a 3-year/5-year plan for building one, or two
  new dorms adjacent to these facilities to increase the on-campus traditional student-athlete population by 50% in five years, and
  by 100% in 10 years. The strategy removes the existing, outdated one-story dorm buildings. These small dorms do not provide
  curb appeal and negatively impact the ability to market student life amenities to prospective students and their families.

Of Students and Staff noted that if given the choice, they would prioritized improvements to academic and administration facilities.

- Create a centralized location for student services, alumni services, and administrative services. As well as prioritize a new two-story structure with space for the business operations of these services, event rooms, hospitality features, and the ability to have indoor activities. This would be a facility that serves the admin, students, alumni, and the community while creating a common core to ICC's Campus.
- Enhance and expand the academic and lab facilities to train the most common and in-demand trades, such as plumbing, HVAC, Electrical, Lighting, Carpentry, Cabinet-making, Machine Fabrication, Automotive Engines, Auto Body Repair, Aviation Industry, Agriculture, etc. These make up the backbone of all successful, thriving communities. These trades also go hand-in-hand with entrepreneurial and maker programs which take these basic skills and allow them to be used in creative and problem-solving ways.
- Enhance the overall visual attractiveness of the campus with walking trails, landscape, people spaces, art, building exteriors, etc.

  The goal of this strategy is to create unique and distinguishing aspects of the campus to impress new visitors.
- Enhance the connection of the east side of campus with the west side by improving the existing bridge, and adding one or two new means to cross the water features or ravine running north and south through campus.
- Enhance the student campus experience with a new, larger, student union and cafeteria. The new student union will offer
  options for quick-serve meals, and after-hour meals for students and athletes whose schedules do not coordinate with
  traditional cafeteria hours. The Student Union will also include spaces for students to study and gather.
- Enhance academic student and student-athlete experience by building a new wellness center, large enough to accommodate both everyday uses by students as well as training schedules for athletes. The wellness center needs to be located in a central part of campus, in close proximity to academics, sports, and other everyday facilities for convenience.
- Modernize and expand the existing academic facilities to have easily located entries, lobbies, restrooms, and areas to study in between classes. The addition of classrooms to allow for relocation of West-Campus, expansion of existing programs, and inclusion of new program offerings. This goal also promotes maintaining West Campus as an investment opportunity or selling West Campus in order to raise capital for on-campus improvements.
- Expand and modernize the Fine Arts facility. Scope to include modernizing and upgrading the existing theater for small-venue needs, lectures, conferences, etc. Rebuild the performance programs for instrumental music. Expand the visual arts programs to open more offerings for painting, sculpture, photography, etc. Include more mixed media use of film, television, digital effects, etc. Add a new 50% larger performance hall/theater for larger audience use and production capabilities. Think of it as a regional destination and force multiplayer when used in conjunction with the existing Inge Theater.

After speaking with ICC students, athletes, faculty, and community leaders and members, Architect One identified the key priorities within the sports and athletic venues survey category. After compiling the data and survey results, it is the recommendation of Architect One, that ICC prioritizes bringing softball back to campus. Bringing softball to campus would allow ICC to develop its sports identity and will allow students, faculty, and community members to enjoy on-campus sports venues and entertainment.

## **Academic Facilities - Student & Administration Services**

With 28 areas of study, ranging from Business and Technology, Career Technology, Fine Arts, Humanities and Social Science, Math, and Science programs, ICC aims at serving the best interests of students and community members. By promoting academic excellence while maintaining cultural and economic enrichment, ICC has separated itself from other similar colleges and institutions.

To add to ICC's already well-established academic programs and facilities, it became clear from survey results that students, staff, and community members wanted to prioritize improving and adding to the existing academic programs and facilities at ICC. The addition and improvement of academic facilities will help to prioritize students and staff, while also serving as recruiting and retention tools for generations of students to come.





This strategic plan is a living document. The committee identified six key initiatives that are critical to our plan's success and will be the measure of the college's general performance. The key Initiatives are in harmony with the ICC Purpose Statements: Community Engagement, Academic Excellence, Economic Development, Cultural Diversity and Excellence, and Financial Sustainability.

#### These Key Initiatives are:

- - Develop and deliver distinctive and high-quality academic, entrepreneurial, fine arts, athletics, and cultural programming that makes ICC a destination for students globally. Develop clear pathways to 4-year transfer and workforce readiness through a college degree or certificate completion.
- Implement plans for recruitment and retention of quality employees. Increase faculty and staff development opportunities and support. Create development programs, including leadership and expertise training.
- Engage the service area community by development/redevelopment of 3 Collaborative partnerships and training programs that offer value to our students, our college, and the community we serve.
- Develop college outreach and promotions to maximize awareness of ICC through clear initiatives and additional strategic recruitment to grow enrollment and establish ICC's identity and brand.
- Increase enrollment, retention, and completion rates using the 2018-2019 baseline, 5 setting specific goals. Consider anticipated results of action steps and anticipated state demographic trends, student socioeconomic factors, and financial aid availability.
- Ensure ICC performs in a socially and fiscally responsible manner through the creation of a dedicated, detailed funding plan and unique revenue streams to meet college needs and capital improvement projects. Work with the ICC Foundation to substantially increase traditional fundraising and develop a more comprehensive alumni association and network.






Conceptual Image of ICC Softball Field






Enlarged Site Plan: Welcome Entrance

#### **CURRENT CONDITIONS:**

The first impression visitors, students, and faculty have upon entering the ICC Campus is the welcome sign. Welcome signs are important for signaling the main entrance of a college and help to create a dialog with visitors. 












Create a facilities warehouse that will accommodate facility and ground maintenance crews in area on campus.

Develop an NCAA Men's Regulation Baseball field and facility on the main ICC Campus.




Develop a Baseball facility to host game days and practices at an on-campus venue that will allow for athlete, coach, and community involvement and engagement.




#### WHAT IT COULD LOOK LIKE:


