Advanced Placement (AP)

Students who have completed any of the Advanced Placement (AP) tests should have Educational Testing Service send an official report of their scores to the Registrar's Office to receive credit. A maximum of 15 credit hours may be awarded.

A score of "3" or higher is required to receive credit for an equivalent class. A grade of "CR" is recorded on the student's transcript with AP noted as the "transfer institution". Courses with the grade of "CR" are not calculated into GPA.
